GFIA Awarded for Outstanding Achievement in Snow & Ice Control

Grand Rapids, MI – It is no secret that the 2013-14 winter season was unusually brutal, and the Gerald R. Ford International Airport is being recognized for outstanding service for battling the ice and snow.

GFIA was awarded the Balchen/Post Award for "Outstanding Achievement in Airport Snow & Ice Control." The award was presented by The International Aviation Snow Symposium and is given to three categories of commercial airports: Large, Medium and Small. The Gerald R. Ford International Airport was awarded in the "Small" category which is classified by less than 100,000 scheduled operations (take-offs and landings) annually.

GFIA saw 116.0" of snow this season, dating from July 1, 2013 to the present. In an average winter, GFIA removes 83,700,000 cubic feet of snow from the airfield. That's enough to fill 20,000 Olympic-sized swimming pools!

Airport field maintenance staff is responsible for physically clearing snow and ice from the airport's 1.5 million square yards of pavement – that's enough to build a two-lane road to the Mackinac Bridge!
