Gerald R. Ford International Airport to Host Runway 5K



GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. – Lace up your sneakers and get ready for a prime course for a fall 5K – on one of the runways at the Gerald R. Ford International Airport (GFIA).

The Runway 5K is slated for the morning of Saturday, October 7, 2017 on airport grounds. The race will begin near the cargo facilities, under a runway tunnel, loop around by the airport fire station, and wrap around on Runway 8L/26R – GFIA's general aviation runway. The Airport's two other commercial aviation runways will still be operational.

"This is a tremendous opportunity for runners, walkers, and families who want to come out for a Saturday morning stroll or a competitive race, and to experience a fun event on a runway that is normally only being used for aircraft," said GFIA President & CEO Jim Gill. "We are giving West Michigan a chance to experience our facility like never before. This event will not only encourage



family time, but it is promoting a healthy lifestyle and aviation as well as benefitting a wonderful local charity."

GFIA is hosting the event for a small registration fee, but the Airport has selected Make-A-Wish Michigan as its charity of choice to donate the proceeds.

"We're delighted that the Gerald R. Ford International Airport is hosting an event to benefit Make-A-Wish Michigan." said Karen Davis, president & CEO of Make-A-Wish Michigan.
