## **Over 1,200 Participate in Airport Runway 5K**

*GRAND RAPIDS, Mich.* – Over 1,200 runners and walkers laced up their sneakers for a behind-thescenes 5K on one of the runways at the Gerald R. Ford International Airport (GFIA).

The Runway 5K is the first of its kind on airport grounds in over a decade. The last Runway 5K was for the Airport's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2003. The race began near the cargo facilities, continuing under a runway tunnel, looping around by the airport fire station, and wrapped around on Runway 8L/26R – GFIA's general aviation runway. The Airport's two other commercial aviation runways were operational, giving participants a chance to soak in an up-close-and-personal sight.

"This was a tremendous opportunity for runners, walkers, and families who wanted to experience a fun event on one of our runways that is normally only being used for aircraft," said GFIA President & CEO Jim Gill. "It was exciting to see West Michigan come out and experience our facility like never before, plus support a wonderful charity at the same time."



GFIA selected Make-A-Wish Michigan as its charity of choice to donate the race proceeds.
