Over 1,200 Participate in Airport Runway 5K



GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. – Over 1,200 runners and walkers laced up their sneakers for a behind-thescenes 5K on one of the runways at the Gerald R. Ford International Airport (GFIA).

The third annual GRR Runway 5K took place on airport grounds today under sunny but cool conditions. The race began near the southwest side of the Airport's general aviation runway looping by a handful of hangars and aircraft static displays, and wrapping around on Runway 8L/26R – GFIA's general aviation runway. Spectrum Health helicopter AeroMed also provided an aerial flyover for participants and spectators to enjoy.

"For the competitive runners it was a nice, smooth course under a different kind of scene, and for walkers and families this was an opportunity for those who wanted to experience an enjoyable event on one of our runways that is normally only used for aircraft," said GFIA president & CEO



Tory Richardson. "It was a beautiful day for a race, and we were happy to host. It not only gave us a chance to show off our facility but support a wonderful charity at the same time."
